

Why NOT to Use Bulk Hand Cleaners

Traditional dip-in buckets pose many dangers:

- Dangerous items often fall into open buckets i.e. glass, metal fragments and saw blades
- Bacteria from cuts and other sources can cross contaminate following users
- Product is unmeasured and often over-used - the average use per hand wash is 40ml
- Excess product lands on floors making them hazardous
